Child Care forms may also be turned in at the individual school during the official school registration days. **For care on the first day of school, all forms must be submitted by August 23, 2018.** Please allow for a two-day processing period for all registrations.

Students cannot attend child care without the following registration information:

1. Behavior Guidelines and Discipline Policy-Signature Required.
2. Consent for Medical Treatment.
3. The Registration Fee of \$50.00 per student (payable to C.U.S.D. Child Care). **Sibling Care requires a \$200.00 onetime registration fee per student.** The Registration Fee is non-refundable and will be applied to your first month's tuition. **Enrollment is completed without the Registration Fee.**

Before & After School Enrichment Program

Child Care will open at 6:30 a.m. on the first day of school, Thursday, August 23, 2018.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Child Care opens at 6:30 a.m. and closes at 6:00 p.m. daily. The Kindergarten site is located at the Early Childhood Development Center (the "ECDC" — 199 6th Street). The Office of the Child Care Director is also located there. Village Elementary School/CMS students in grades 1st through 6th will be at Village (600 6th Street). Silver Strand Elementary students TK through 5th will be at Silver Strand (1360 Leyte Rd.)

ACTIVITIES:

The children (TK – 6TH) will be participating in a variety of daily indoor and outdoor activities and sports, arts and crafts, fitness games, activity clubs, and more! The homework club is currently only available for 1st – 6th grade at Village Elementary.

BEFORE SCHOOL CARE:

We offer care starting at 6:30 a.m. in Village Hall for Village & CMS students, in the Child Care room at Silver Strand, and in Classroom B at the ECDC for Kindergarteners. Children must be checked-in upon arrival. VILLAGE AFTERCARE students need to be brought into Village Hall for check in. SILVER STRAND students need to be brought into the Child Care building through the staff parking lot entrance located on the South-East end of the campus.

The students start their day with art, games, and quiet reading. Breakfast is not available through the District, but children are welcome to bring their own. For students that bring a breakfast, they may eat at arrival. The students are escorted to their respective playgrounds and will line up with their classmates to meet their teachers. CMS students will walk to the Middle School at 7:50 a.m. ECDC Kindergarten students are picked up by playground staff and join their classmates on the playground prior to going to their individual classrooms with their teachers.

SIBLING PROGRAM:

Child Care offers supervision on the playground for 1st - 3rd graders who have older or younger siblings enrolled in C.U.S.D. schools. The children will be able to play on the playground for 35 minutes until the sibling is dismissed from school. All children in this program must be enrolled and will be required to check-in every day. The child must be checked out by a sibling, parent or guardian every day as well.

AFTER SCHOOL CHECK-IN:

EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Children in Rooms 4 - 7 walk to the Child Care Classroom (Room A) under the supervision of their teachers. Children in Rooms 1 - 3 are picked-up by Child Care staff. All children are signed-in by staff.

VILLAGE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

The Child Care staff will check-in the children on the Sixth Street playground at Village Elementary School when they are released from their classrooms. After the students are checked-in, they continue to use the playground until 2:55 p.m. at which time they will then transition to Village Hall. Coronado Middle School students must come to Village Hall through the elementary office to check-in.

SILVER STRAND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

The children from grades 1st – 5th will walk to the Child Care building located in the back of the elementary campus next to the baseball field when they are released from their classrooms. TK and Kinder students will be escorted to child care and picked up by after care staff. The children will play on playground after the 2:20 dismissal until 3:00 p.m. Then they will proceed into the Child Care room for snack, homework, games and activities.

SNACKS:

Snacks are not provided at Child Care. Please pack an extra mid-afternoon snack for your child. C.U.S.D. has nutritional guidelines for all the students. The child care program follows these guidelines. We do not encourage parents to bring any food items to child care that do not meet these nutritional standards.

PARENT PICK-UP:

All children must be checked-out at pick-up time. If you are going to have someone else pick-up your child that is not on the emergency contact list, an email may be sent to the Director for a one-time emergency authorization. All additions, deletions, corrections or updates must be made by the enrolling individuals only. The children will not be allowed to leave without an authorized individual. Photo identification is required. Please alert all individuals picking up to bring a photo identification.

Kids Club Connection



Returning for the 2018-2019 school year in after care is the Kids Club Connection (KCC). Each day of the week, the child care program offers a club for students to participate in and have fun. (Kindergarteners continue with its age-appropriate arts and crafts of the season, story time, music, and games.) First through third graders will have the opportunity to play for 40 minutes until the fourth and fifth graders arrive. At 3:00pm, our daily club will start and activities will continue until 4:00pm each day. The Wednesday club schedule is one hour earlier: 2:00-3:00pm. Of course, if you need child care, we will still close at 6:00pm. Listed below is the schedule of clubs. A description of each club follows. We take great delight in seeing how much the children enjoy all the activities.

- ☆ Monday: Game Day
- ☆ Tuesday: Crafts A Plenty
- ☆ Wednesday: Chefs in the Making
- ☆ Thursday: Tons of Fun
- ☆ Friday: Creative Art

Monday through Thursday: Homework Club

(For one hour each day, we offer support to the students that need some assistance with homework but we do not offer tutoring.)

Kids Club Connection

Game Day: Students participate in a variety of outdoor or indoor games. Games include Relays, Kickball, Bingo, Building Contests, Car Lot, Steal the Bacon, Wax Museum, Freeze Tag, Four Corners, and Tumbling to name a few. Look for “Just Dance” — a favorite with the kids.

Crafts A Plenty: Each month, students create a weekly craft with a common theme. Some of the themes in the past have been Sun & Beach, Zoo Animals, Winter Wonderland, All Things Green, Spring Has Sprung, Race Cars, Pirates, Around the World, and Star Spangle Salute. We will also celebrate holidays with crafts in October, December and February.

Chefs in the Making: Wednesdays are our cooking days. We all know kids love to eat, but we want them to realize cooking is fun and a great activity to do with friends and family. We will teach the students how to choose healthy foods and read recipes. The students will enjoy creating unique snacks that are delicious as well as fun to make. When possible, we will incorporate the monthly holidays into our food preparation.

Tons of Fun: Our Thursday club changes each month. We’ve offered Simply Science, Halloween Happenings, Autumn Leaves, Holiday Traditions, Snowflakes in Coronado, Kings and Queens, World of Animals, and Flowers — to name just a few. The creativity of the staff shines as we develop the monthly activities.

Creative Art: The activities in this club allow children to creatively express themselves through art. We are eager to expose the students to many forms of art and art expression. Our interest is in the content, motive, and process of their art. The activities are open-ended in that there is no one right way to do it.



Behavior Guidelines and Discipline Policy

It is the goal of C.U.S.D. Child Care to provide a safe, positive, and orderly environment where children and adults demonstrate respect and support for each other at all times. Students must take responsibility for their own actions, as well as the consequences of those actions. Our policy for managing student behavior is based on the following district guidelines:

School-wide Discipline Plan

“Discipline” is from the Old English word meaning “to teach or train”. Discipline is teaching children rules to live by and helping them become socialized into their culture. It is a process that uses teaching, modeling, and other appropriate strategies to maintain the behaviors necessary to ensure a safe, orderly, and productive learning environment by changing unacceptable behavior to acceptable behavior.

Good discipline is also another word for respect - respect for authority, others, self, and rules. Discipline is an attitude that begins at home, is reinforced at school, and is applied through life. Attitudes about behavior are learned. Students learn this from home and school. We work together to create a healthy attitude toward discipline that will be rewarding throughout a student’s life.

Village Elementary and Silver Strand Elementary have school-wide discipline plans intended to:

- Keep students and staff safe
- Teach students to exercise self-control and to develop appropriate social skills
- Reinforce responsibility for actions
- Maintain focus on learning and teaching
- Model and encourage good choices
- Provide consistent and equitable standards
- Provide/enforce logical consequences
- Require an atmosphere conducive to learning in all school areas
- Spend more time on **prevention**, and less on **intervention**.

Teachers and staff focus on positive behaviors while working to help students understand the natural consequences of their behavior, both positive and negative. The school-wide discipline plans are based on the key goals of **Restorative Discipline**:

- To understand the harm and develop empathy for both the harmed and the harmer
- To listen and respond to the needs of the person harmed and the person who harmed
- To encourage accountability and responsibility through personal reflection within a collaborative planning process
- To reintegrate the harmer (and, if necessary, the harmed) into the community as valuable, contributing members
- To create caring climates to support healthy communities
- To charge the system when it contributes to the harm.

In addition, we believe that:

- All children are inherently good. All behaviors are learned from the responses children receive in their environment.
- There is a strong partnership between the school and parents. Frequent communication is essential.
- All students have the ability to behave appropriately and start with a “clean slate” each day
- The misbehavior of one student will not be allowed to interfere with the learning opportunities of other students
- The misbehavior of a student will neither interfere with nor excuse him/her from successfully completing the learning objectives
- Every discipline situation is an opportunity for children to learn responsibility and develop a plan for correcting what went wrong
- Expected behaviors must be communicated, taught, and modeled throughout the year.

Behavior Notices (Referrals)

School personnel may give behavior notices (referrals) to students who make poor choices breaking school rules in the classroom, on the playground, or in/on any part of the Village/ECDC/Strand campuses. Consequences for referrals are dependent upon their frequency and severity. Classroom teachers and school administration are provided with copies of all referrals. Parents are notified of referral, require a signature, and should be returned to the teacher the following day. Students with frequent behavior notices may spend time with the school counselor, Assistant Principal or Principal.
